Other visitor facilities Ensure that any new provision helps overcome visitor pressures and increases visitor enjoyment and understanding. The role of facilities in influencing visitor numbers and distribution must be carefully considered, as well as their landscape impact. New provision should not increase traffic pressures in these Zones.

Investigate use and development of facilities that encourage use of this Zone in preference to other Zones, aiming to avoid any overall increase in the number of visits to the AONB. Any new facilities should increase visitor enjoyment and understanding, building upon its special qualities.
